The main organizers will be the Norwegian Amm organization, Norsk Brunbielag and the SICAMM Main Board, with support also from the European Beekeeping Association. 
Preliminary distribution of presenters (numbers in different colors) from 15 different countries during the SICAMM Conference 2025.

6. SICAMM MEMBERSHIP OPTIONS

SICAMM (Societas internationalis pro conservatione Apis melliferae melliferae) is a politically independent and denominationally neutral Association. It was founded in 1994 but has undergone several changes through the last decades. Last year, SICAMM became a federation. SICAMM promotes a sustainable approach to beekeeping through the conservation of native honey bee subspecies within their natural range, protecting genetic diversity and supporting sustainable beekeeping.

The Association strives to achieve this goal through, a) the exchange of information, education and advice, b) representing SICAMM's interests vis-à-vis political bodies and the general public, c) supporting participation in, and implementation of, scientific and applied research projects for the benefit of native honey bees. SICAMM shall seek constructive cooperation with government bodies, research facilities, beekeepers' organisations, environmental organisations, and any other organisations who support the objectives of SICAMM. SICAMM is exclusively a not-for-profit organisation and does not pursue any profit-making, or the self-interest of individuals. Individuals working for its members act in a voluntary capacity.

Membership is open to individuals and legal entities who support the objectives of SICAMM. Membership fees will be set by the Annual General Assembly. Honorary members, and Members holding office on the Main Board and the Scientific Board, are exempt from paying membership fees. Membership fees are due for the whole of the year of admission.

Application for Active Membership can be submitted at any time to the Main Board. Upon admission by the Main Board, membership is provisional and voting rights are pending until confirmation by the Annual General Assembly.

Individual membership fee: 50 Euro per year

Association membership: Annual flat fee of 200 Euro + 2 % of membership income per year, designated in Euros.

Team Campaign, whose purpose is to lobby for Amm and sustainable bee management, and to distribute information about Amm to a broader audience (non-SICAMM members, authorities, participants at conferences and workshops, etc.), as well as to apply for financial support for useful projects.



Team Conference, whose purpose is to organize the biennial international conference. The team is always composed of members from the SICAMM Main Board and the local organizers. For the year 2025, the local organizers will be the Norwegian Amm Association, the Norsk Brunbielag.



Team Identification of honey bee lines (genetics and conservation), no team has yet been formed around this. The formation of this will be further discussed during the SICAMM Conference 2025.
